TIPS TO AVOID SCAMS

You are pressured to act immediately. You should start verifying their identity and think about how they should prove to you who they say they are. In many circumstances, scammers seem helpful. They can seem friendly and sympathetic. But often time they use other more forceful tactics as shown below.

- They instruct you that they are with Caprock Federal Credit Union. In many social engineering schemes people are trying to fish for various aspects of your identity to obtain or even confirm the accuracy of a piece of your identity. We at Caprock Federal Credit Union will never contact you and ask you for your identifying information. We will ask other items such as information about your last deposit or even setup a passcode for the verification of your identity.
- They may pressure you to send money or give them you debit card or account number with the credit union. In many circumstances they ask you to go to a store and obtain gift cards. These is their way of making off with the money.
- They may pressure you with law enforcement action. Many of these involve them impersonation a government agency such as the Social Security Administration of the IRS asking you for immediate payment of to verify your personal Information. Scammers easily threaten lawsuits or law information action. Again, this is to trick you into acting with haste.

WHAT YOU CAN DO

- Check your account balances frequently and look at your transaction history. Make sure to utilize online banking and mobile apps to quickly verify your account.
- Keep your information accurate with your banking institutions.
 We cannot trust address correction or forwarding from the U.S. Postal Service.
- Phone numbers should always be accurate for your Financial Institution as well. Many Financial institution are capable to quickly verifying suspicious transactions through a text to your cell phone. Text message rates may apply.
- Keep a list of your plastic cards with the lost/stolen information in a safe place so that you can quickly call if your purse or wallet is missing or stolen. Scammers know to act quickly with these cards and will drain and account as fast as possible. In addition, keep a backup card or some funds in a safe place in case your identity.
- Be cautious about people you ask to help you do something with your phone or computer. There a many hackers who will copy information from the areas of your phone or computer. They are well versed in obtaining the information quickly sometimes right in front of you.
